

Access to primary care - we are seeking to understand the barriers that may prevent people from Black or Asian minoritised communities from accessing sight (eye) tests - <u>Eye sight survey</u> closes 28 November 2025





Social care - we are looking at NHS Health Checks. These checks are free for anyone between the ages of 40 and 74 (who doesn't have one or more of a number of pre-existing conditions), but how much do you know about them? Why are people not taking them up? - Health checks survey closes 31 December 2025
