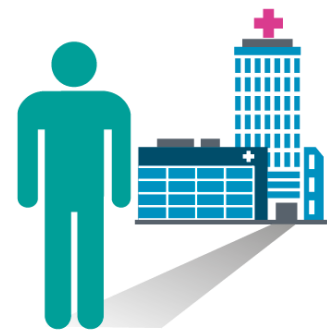
Are you passionate about young people's rights, health and wellbeing?
