


The Stroke Survivor and Carer Panel wants to hear from members of the public and patients to help make stroke services better.



We want to set up a panel of people with lived experience to help us to do this.

We are looking for people:



•Who have had a stroke

•Who care for someone who has had a stroke



You must live in Frimley / Surrey Heartlands



This pack tells you about the panel and the roles you could apply for.



We are looking for someone to be the 'chair of the panel' and we are looking for 'panel members'.



These would be voluntary. We will reimburse expenses.

We would also offer an optional recognition fee of £25 per half day, which includes time to read papers and attend meetings.



The information below tells you more about our work and information about being part of the panel. You could then apply for one of the roles if you think you have the right skills and free time.

What is the Frimley / Surrey Heartlands Integrated Stroke Delivery Network?



The Frimley and Surrey Heartlands Integrated Stroke Delivery Network is trying to make stroke care better for people and families.



To be able to do this we want to make sure the views of people who have had strokes and their family members are at the centre of this work.

What is the Frimley and Surrey Heartlands Stroke Survivor and Carer Panel?



The panel will provide the voice of lived experience. This helps make decisions to improve the care and support for those who have had a stroke or those

who care for people who have had a stroke.



Panel members will be asked to think about the future of stroke care, based on their own experience, and what people may want and need in the future.



The panel will be made up of 15 people who will meet every 3 months. The meetings will happen online and in person. The meetings will last 2 hours. The panel will be asked to share their ideas and opinions.



Job Roles

Job Role 1 - Chair of the panel The Chair would:



Help to plan the meetings



• Make sure people are listened to and heard



• Tell managers and other professionals what people with lived experience think is important

• Help new members join the panel



• Go to the Integrated Stroke Delivery Network (ISDN) Board meeting with managers and professionals once every 3 months (4 times a year)



• Make sure people work together

It is desirable to have Chair experience but not essential. Also please note that requirements for a Chair differ slightly differ from a Panel Member.



Panel Member Job

What would I need to do?



• The panel member would go to meetings and share their views and ideas with other people in the group



• Go to the meetings every 3 months. This means you would go to 4 meetings a year



• Talk to other people to find out their views and ideas



• Share your views and ideas

work to find a time that suits you.
