# Special edition 2022 - A Year in Review



In January, we shared news that we had treated a cervical cancer patient with the aid of artificial intelligence (AI) in a UK first. The AI technology uses daily CT scans to target the specific areas that need radiotherapy. This helps to avoid damage to healthy tissue and limit side-effects.


## o Mother's Day &



The National Institute for Health Research (NIHR) awarded £1m to our Trust and our partner the University of Surrey to form a new NIHR Clinical Research Facility. The facility will expand the shared medical research capabilities of the hospital and university, providing dedicated space. specialist equipment and skilled staff to support early-stage clinical research. including first-in-human clinical trials.



In April. we announced an extra 25.000 people in Surrey. West Sussex and Hampshire borders had participated in bowel cancer screening. The Surrey Bowel Cancer Screening Centre. hosted by our Trust. was one of the first in England to reduce the screening age to 56 years old.





Our Trust Chair. Sue Sjuve. was awarded a Fellowship of the University of Surrey for her outstanding contribution to Royal Surrey and the benefits her work has brought to Guildford residents and the wider region.

In June, we shared our £6.2million plans to expand and modernise our St Luke's Cancer Centre, which is a major regional cancer treatment centre. The plans for the hospital's St Luke's Cancer Centre double the amount of clinical space to support the increasing demand for its cancer services.







In a UK first, during summer 2022 doctors at Royal Surrey treated their 5.000th prostate cancer patient with brachytherapy - radioactive 'seeds' implanted in or near a tumour to treat cancer. This is an alternative treatment to surgery that can have fewer side effects.



A group of 14 amazing fundraisers, including eight brave staff from Royal Surrey, leapt an impressive 10.000ft out of a plane to raise money for Royal Surrey Charity.







### Remembering Her Majesty

We welcomed Angela Richardson. MP for Guildford to the Trust to unveil a new wall display outside the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) to raise awareness of organ donation. The display, commissioned by the Trust's Organ Donation Committee (donated by the Organ Donation Trust), shows the hightech equipment used to treat ICU patients.



We received a very special visit from Her Royal Highness the Princess of Wales. She came to find out more about our outstanding-rated maternity unit, where she met staff and patients to hear about our work with pregnant women and new mothers.

We celebrated our hard working staff with the Royal Surrey Stars awards in November.

We received 350 nominations from colleagues and patients across 16 categories. These were whittled down to a shortlist of finalists who were invited to attend the awards ceremony, which was held at Guildford Cathedral.

We opened our new 'Changing Places' toilet designed for young people and adults with severe and multiple Learning Disabilities and people with a range of physical disabilities or mobility issues.

The high-tech loo has an adult-sized changing bench with privacy screen, a hoist, and a toilet with a self-cleaning function.
